About Our Keynote Speaker

George C. Herring, Professor Emeritus, University of Kentucky. A leading authority on U.S. foreign relations, he is the former editor of *Diplomatic History* and a past president of the Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations. He is the author of many works including *America’s Longest War: The United States and Vietnam, 1950-1975*. His recent book, *From Colony to Superpower: U.S. Foreign Relations Since 1776*, is the twelfth in the Oxford History of the United States series, and the first to focus on a single subject, U.S. foreign policy. This book won the Robert Ferrell Prize, Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations and was a finalist for the National Book Critics Circle Award.
